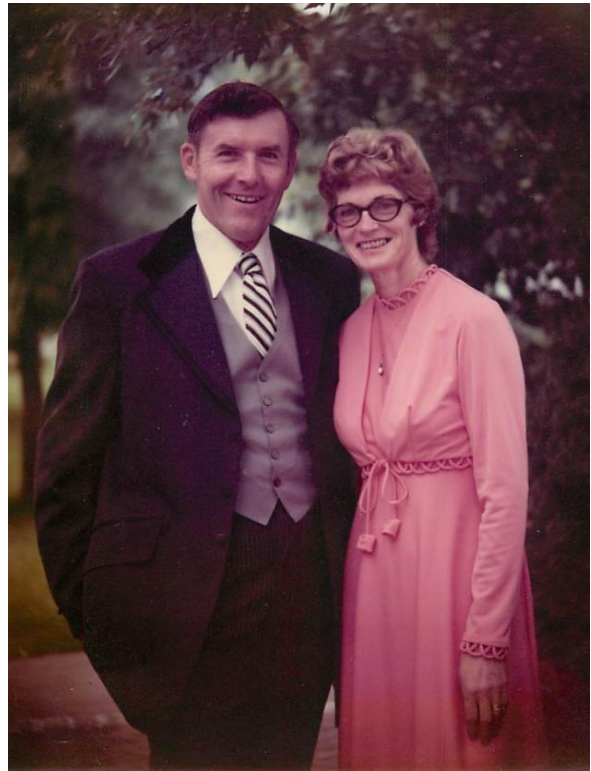


The Paul and Donna Altman Scholarship Fund

Over the years, they demonstrated their belief in the importance of hard work, raising livestock and growing grain, while also instilling these values in their children. Although post-secondary education wasn't mandatory, Paul and Donna understood that it could expand one's lifelong opportunities.

Paul served for several years on the school board of the North Judson-San Pierre School system. He strived to maintain the best educational environment for the students in the district. Donna held down the home front, making sure their children were prepared for school each day enabling them to succeed.



Through their hard work and dedication, Paul and Donna were able to send three of their children to colleges in Indiana, at which they received degrees and are reaping the benefits to this day. Paul and Donna gave their fourth child the opportunity to work alongside them on the family farm. Several years later, he also received a college education.

The family of Paul and Donna created the Paul and Donna Altman Scholarship Fund in order to honor Paul and Donna Altman and commemorate their belief that a person should never settle for a career that doesn't bring happiness. Instead, they thought that one should strive to push his or her limits and expand his or her opportunities.

The criteria that students must meet in order to qualify for the scholarship includes: being active in their school and community, showing good citizenship, and enrolling at any two or four-year college, university, or trade school. It is the hope of the Altman family that, through this scholarship, Paul and Donna's belief in the importance of post-secondary schooling will be realized by high school seniors for many years to come.
